## Opportunities for Study and Prayer

This fall, two new groups are forming to engage with scripture and to engage in prayer. Those who are interested will determine the schedule. If you are interested, please email Fr. - Reading Scripture can be daunting! To take out some of the challenge, we will gather to read through 25 Bible stories that will introduce us to the entire arc of the Scripture. What is more, if you cannot join us at our regular meeting time, we will create an electronic discussion space—maybe on Facebook or possibly through a blog on our website—where those who wish to participate but cannot attend can connect with these stories. Particular texts will be listed in the bulletin and in the email news (or you can buy a copy of *The Path: a Journey through the Bible*). The goal is to get a taste of scripture and gain some ideas about where we might like to read together next.

- Prayer Group Forming: There are many ways that we can approach prayer together, and this group will first choose a method. We might gather for the Eucharist, praying for healing for ourselves and the world. We might gather for Evening Prayer. We might come together to learn about prayer forms, especially contemplative forms of prayer such as the Jesus Prayer or Centering Prayer. At our initial meeting, we'll see what the group desires. Our first gathering will be in mid- to late September.

## First Steps Grant awarded to All Saints

Congratulations to us! The Diocese of New York annually awards grants for programs that to help parishes grow. These grants are ideally “seed money” so that a program can get rolling. We applied for funding to build our Toddler Group and to expand the model to other age groups, and the Diocese awarded us \$1,500. This is a nice vote of confidence from the Congregational Vitality Team for the efforts that we are undertaking at All Saints' Church.

## Mission News—opportunities to help those in need

### Supporting Harrison Food Pantry

All Saints' Church has long supported the Harrison Food Pantry. We have a great history of gathering non-perishable goods for those who are hungry. The Harrison Food Pantry serves approximately 120 families, which equates to 325 individuals. One third of their clients are senior citizens. What is more, 90% of those who receive SNAP benefits (formerly called Food Stamps) run out of funds by the 21st of the month, which can make for a difficult end of the month.

In addition to our ongoing collection of non-perishable foods, we will have one food focus every month to help us more intentionally reflect on hunger. This fall we will gather:

- September: Peanut Butter
- October: Juice Boxes (100% juice) and Milk Boxes
- November: Cooking Oils: Canola, Olive, Etc.
- December: Pasta

We may not be able to end hunger, but we can do something to help those who are hungry.

### Annual School Supply Drive

Our Annual School Supply Drive continues through September 10. We are gathering a variety of supplies to help students in the area who would otherwise struggle to buy school supplies.
